White County Circuit Court Awarded Technology Grant for the Second Year

White County Circuit Court has been awarded a technology grant for the second consecutive year from the Technology Modernization Funding Program offered by the Illinois Supreme Court and the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts. This year's grant award was in the amount of \$43,507.36, bringing the total awarded over the last two years to \$60,105.78.

Scott Webb and Circuit Clerk Kelly Fulkerson sought the funding made available to county courts throughout Illinois by obtaining bids for equipment upgrades and drafting the grant proposal. Technology upgrades, including new software, computers, and printers are just some of the many enhancements to the court made possible by the grant.

Judge Webb and Circuit Clerk Fulkerson have worked to enhance their court technology with these funds for the last two years keeping these costs from being passed on to the people of White County. These upgrades are essential to maintain the efficient operation of the White County Circuit Court and the Circuit Clerk's Office and it has been my pleasure to assist them in this process."
